Based in Medie, Accra, the Saakumu Dance Troupe has performed at important governmental functions, national and international music and dance festivals throughout Ghana and West Africa. The SDT is the designated official performing group at this year's National Festival of Art and Culture (NAFAC), the largest cultural festival in Ghana.

Our work involves community outreach and educational programs in schools and colleges. Instrumentation include (gyil) African xylophone, drums, calabash water drums and the praise singing (talking drums) of the Akan and Dagbamba people of Ghana. The group is eager to share its music and dances with the rest of the world.
