The Williams Symphonic Winds and the Opus Zero Band—the highly flexible chamber ensemble extension of the Symphonic Winds—are committed to presenting innovative and provocative performances featuring the most significant music written today. Leading proponents of the performance of new music on the Williams campus, these ensembles have commissioned and/or premiered works by numerous composers including Louis Andriessen, Eve Beglarian, Lukas Foss, Kyle Gann, Judd Greenstein '01, Michael Torke, Jay Wadley, Williams department chair David Kechley, and numerous Williams students. Recognized as among the premier wind ensembles in New England, the Symphonic Winds performed at the 2006 College Band Directors National Association Eastern Division Conference in New Jersey, while the Opus Zero Band will perform at the CBDNA conference at West Chester University in March 2010. Recent highlights for the ensembles include a 2009 winter tour to Argentina, a collaboration with student composers and the Williams Dance Company in April 2009, and the 2008 performance (collegiate premiere) of Louis Andriessen's *De Materie*, which was described by critic Barton McLean as "heroic" and "astounding," while Andriessen himself remarked, "I am very impressed by the level of performance and [the] first class playing and singing. The playing is amazingly good.... I was really moved by what I would like to call the great enthusiasm, power and energy of the musicians."

Artist-in-Residence **Steven Dennis Bodner** is in his tenth year at Williams College where he is Music Director of the Symphonic Winds and Opus Zero Band, teaches classical saxophone, coaches chamber music, and teaches classes in music fundamentals and aural skills acquisition. He earned a B.A. in philosophy and a B.M. in saxophone performance from Miami (OH) University in 1997, a M.M. in wind ensemble conducting with academic honors and distinction in performance from New England Conservatory in 1999, and he is presently a candidate for the Ph.D. in music education at the University of Massachusetts Amherst. In demand as a teacher and clinician, Steven has conducted ensembles and adjudicated festivals throughout New England, New York, Ohio, and Virginia. As a saxophonist, he is the founding co-director of the I/O New Music Ensemble, is a member of the Berkshire Symphony and Williams Chamber Players, and has recently performed at the Manchester Music Festival and with the NotaRiotous Ensemble.
