

About Allen Shawn

Allen Shawn (born 1948) grew up in New York City in a literary family. He started composing music at the age of ten, and was encouraged in his composing by his piano teachers, Frances Dillon and Emilie Harris, who introduced him to the music of Stravinsky, Schoenberg, Berg, Prokofiev, and Ives. Later on his composition teachers included Leon Kirchner, Earl Kim, Nadia Boulanger and Jack Beeson.

Shawn lives in Vermont and has been on the music faculty of Bennington College since 1985. An active pianist, he is also the author of four books, *Arnold Schoenberg's Journey* (2002); *Wish I Could Be There* (2007); *Twin* (2011); and *Leonard Bernstein- American Musician* (2014), as well as articles for the *New York Review of Books, The Atlantic Monthly, The Musical Times, The Times Literary Supplement*, and the *New York Times Magazine*. He has been a recipient of both a Goddard Lieberson Fellowship, and an An Academy Award from the American Academy of Arts and Letters.

Among his works are a dozen orchestral pieces, including a Symphony, two Piano Concertos, a Violin Concerto, a Cello Concerto, and a Double Concerto for Clarinet and Cello; five Piano Sonatas and many additional piano pieces, including several for piano four-hands and two pianos; much chamber music; vocal music; and three chamber operas. His recordings include numerous chamber music CDs; four volumes of piano music, including a recent CD devoted to his work by the German pianist, Julia Bartha; his Piano Concerto performed by Ursula Oppens with the Albany Symphony, conducted by David Alan Miller; and his chamber opera, *The Music Teacher*, to a libretto by his brother Wallace, on Bridge Records.
