Williams Percussion Ensemble

In programs featuring cutting edge new and experimental music, and important works of the twentieth-century, WiPE surveys a vast terrain of sound and rhythm. The ensemble employs all manner of percussion instruments, found sounds, and electronics to create music that resonates across boundaries of genre and discipline. In addition to music for percussion alone, the group presents works for mixed ensembles and new and experimental music for other instruments, and often works directly with composers. The ensemble also collaborates with artists in diverse media in order to explore the connections between different types of sound, form, image, and movement.

Matthew Gold

Matthew Gold is an Artist Associate in percussion at Williams College where he directs the Williams Percussion Ensemble and co-directs I/O New Music. Based in New York, he is a percussionist with a deep commitment to new music. A member of Talea Ensemble and the Talujon percussion group, and a former co-director of TimeTable Percussion, he performs regularly with Sequitur, the Argento Chamber Ensemble, Da Capo Chamber Players, SEM Ensemble, and many others. Recent highlights include Talujon's performance of Gérard Grisey's *Le Noir de l'fÉtoile* on the Bang on a Can Marathon in New York and performances of works by Stockhausen and Boulez with the New York Philharmonic on its "Philharmonic 360" program at the Park Avenue Armory. He performs frequently with the Mark Morris Dance Group and the New York City Ballet, serves as an artist-faculty member for the Institute and Festival for Contemporary Performance at Mannes College, and is a member of the resident ensemble at the Walden School's Young Musicians Program. In 2013 he is joining the performance faculty of the annual Composer's Conference at Wellesley College.
