

Matthew Gold

Matthew Gold is an Artist Associate in percussion at Williams College where he directs the Williams Percussion Ensemble and co-directs I/O New Music. Based in New York, he is a percussionist with a deep commitment to new music. A member of the Talujon percussion group and Talea Ensemble, and a former co-director of TimeTable Percussion, he performs regularly with Sequitur, the Argento Chamber Ensemble, Da Capo Chamber Players, SEM Ensemble, and many others. Recent solo appearances include concerto performances with Sequitur, the Charlottesville Chamber Music Festival, and the Williams Symphonic Wind Ensemble. He performs frequently with the Mark Morris Dance Group and the New York City Ballet, and serves as an artist-faculty member for the Institute and Festival for Contemporary Performance at Mannes College.

Zina Ward '12

Zina Ward has played oboe for about 11 years, which now that she thinks about it, is roughly half of her young life. At Williams she's played in the Berkshire Symphony, Symphonic Winds, and various chamber groups and special projects. A highlight of her Williams music experience has been the opportunity to play new and challenging music that makes more (and different) technical demands than a Beethoven symphony or Ferling etude. This particular piece required that she learn a new note, expanding her range by a high G#. She apologizes for that in advance.

Williams Percussion Ensemble

In programs featuring cutting edge new and experimental music, and important works of the twentieth-century, WiPE surveys a vast terrain of sound and rhythm. The ensemble employs all manner of percussion instruments, found sounds, and electronics to create music that resonates across boundaries of genre and discipline. In addition to music for percussion alone, the group presents works for mixed ensembles and new and experimental music for other instruments, and has often worked directly with composers. The ensemble also collaborates with artists in diverse media in order to explore the connections between different types of sound, form, image, and movement.
